

IN THE MATTER of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act)

AND

IN THE MATTER of an application by PALS Hospitality Group Limited for a new ON licence pursuant to Section 100 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 in respect of the premises situated at 1/40 Tuwharetoa Street, Taupo and known as "Rosemary's"

The Application:

This is an application by PALS Hospitality Group Limited for an On Licence in respect of premises situated at 1/40 Tuwharetoa Street, Taupo, known as "Rosemary's". It was formally received by the Taupō District Licensing Committee on 9th February 2022. The general nature of the business to be undertaken is that of Tavern.

The application was duly advertised in the Taupo Times newspaper on the 11th and 18th of February 2022 and no objection or notice of desire to be heard has been received. Display of the public notice has been carried out in the terms of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 by the licensee and no objections were lodged by any members of the public.

The Reasons for the Decision:

The applicants are somewhat new to the late-night hospitality business and understandably the Police the MOOH has expressed concerns about expansion of this business in to the early hours of the morning.

The Act is very clear in Section 53 that substantive single serve food options at reasonable prices and within a reasonable time are necessary as an effective tool to slow intoxication rates. As highlighted by the MOoH the applicant is put on notice that at least 3 types of substantive food must be available and promoted at all times.

Failure to do so will be a breach of licence conditions and the DLC can swiftly rehear any application it has determined.

By agreement, a suite of conditions have been agreed to and will be imposed. The Police and Medical Officer of Health reports raise no matters in opposition.

The Decision:

Subject to the above, we satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in the Act and we grant the applicant an On Licence authorising the sale and supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises, to any person who is present on the premises.

The licence shall be subjected to specific conditions as detailed in the attached licence.

ON LICENCE

(for premises)

Sections 14 to 16, and 64, Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012

Pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012, **PALS HOSPITALITY GROUP LIMITED** is authorised to sell and supply alcohol, on the premises situated at 1/40 Tuwharetoa Street, Taupo and known as “**Rosemary’s**”, to any person for consumption on the premises and to let people consume alcohol there.

The authority conferred by this licence must be exercised through a manager or managers appointed by the licensee in accordance with Subpart 7 of Part 2 of the Act.

CONDITIONS

This licence is subject to the following conditions:

1. Alcohol may be sold or supplied for consumption on the premises only on the following days and hours: **Monday to Sunday from 10.00am to 3.00am the following day.**
2. **A One-Way Door is to operate from 1.00am. No entry from that time. Exit only.**
3. **No shots containing alcoholic spirit shall be sold after 12.00 midnight.**
4. **COA qualified door staff are to be on duty Friday and Saturday from 10.00pm until close.**
5. No alcohol is to be sold or supplied on the premises on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day or before 1.00pm on Anzac Day to any person other than a person who is on the premises to dine.
6. **The whole of the premises is designated as a Supervised area.**
7. Drinking water is to be provided to patrons free of charge from a water supply prominently situated on the premises.
8. The Licensee must have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic and low-alcohol beverages.
9. Food must be available for consumption on the premises at all times the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol, in accordance with the sample menu supplied with the application for this licence or menu variations of a similar range and standard. Menus must be visible, and food should be actively promoted.
10. A properly appointed certificated or Acting or Temporary Manager must be on duty at all times when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol, and their full name must be on a sign prominently displayed in the premises.
11. The Licensee must provide information, advice and assistance about alternative forms of transport available to patrons from the licensed premises.
12. The Licensee must display:
 - a. At every point of sale, signs detailing restrictions on the sale and supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons,
 - b. At the principal entrance to the premises, so as to be easily read by people immediately outside the premises, a sign stating the ordinary hours of business during which the premises will be open for sale of alcohol,
 - c. A copy of the licence attached to the premises so as to be easily read.

THE LICENSED PREMISES

The sale, supply or consumption of alcohol is authorised in the premises generally including the outdoor area. The premises situated at 1/40 Tuwharetoa Street, Taupo, are more precisely identified as outlined in plans date stamped as received by the Taupo District Licensing Committee on 9 February 2022.

DISPLAY OF LICENCE AND PRINCIPAL ENTRANCE

A copy of this licence must be displayed at the principal entrance to the premises. The entrance from Tuwharetoa Street, Taupo is designated as the principal entrance.


DURATION

Subject to the requirements of the Act relating to the payment of fees, and to the provisions of the Act relating to the suspension and cancellation of licences, this licence continues in force -

- (a) Until the close of the period of 1 year commencing with the date of its issue; or
- (b) If an application for the renewal of the licence is duly made, until the application is determined; or
- (c) If the licence is renewed, until the close of the period of 3 years after the period for which it was renewed.

This licence expires on 10 May 2023 unless further renewed
